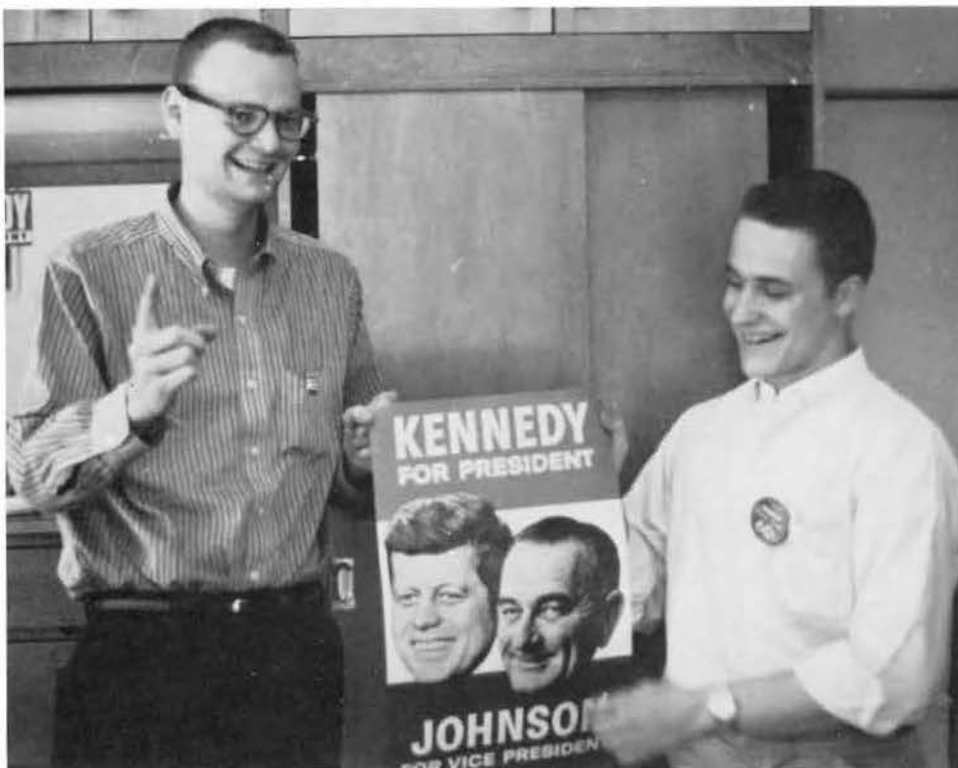

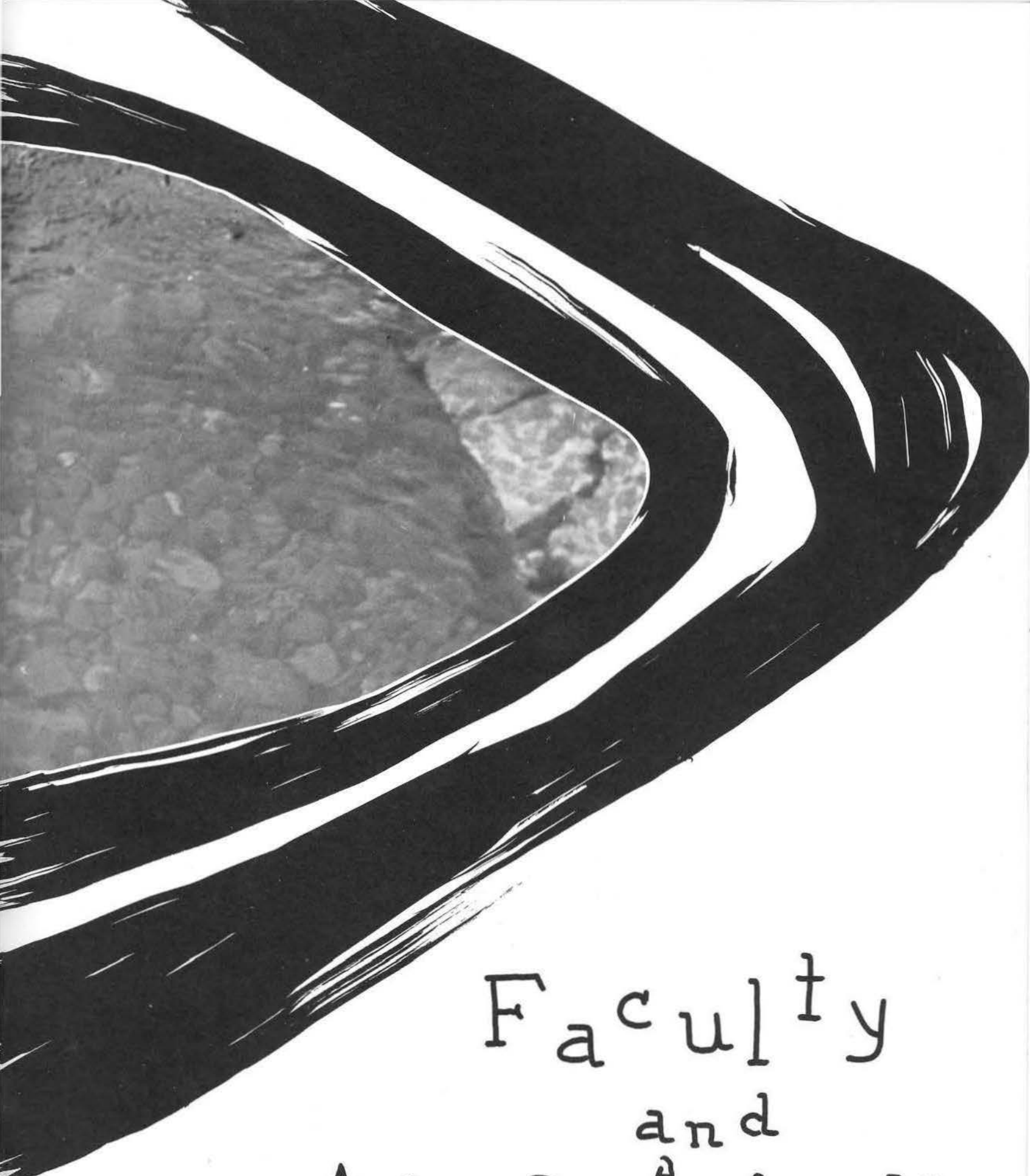

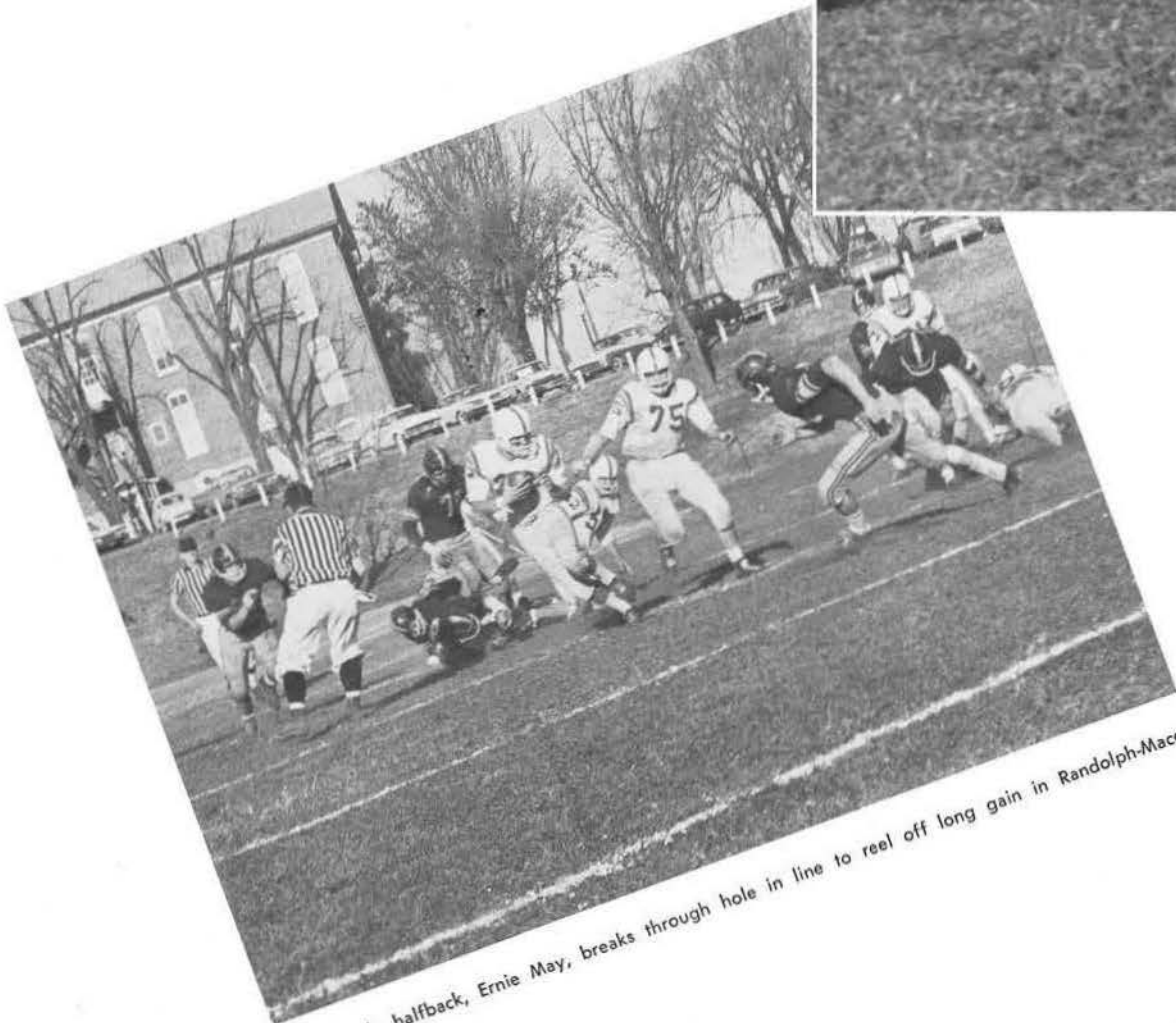

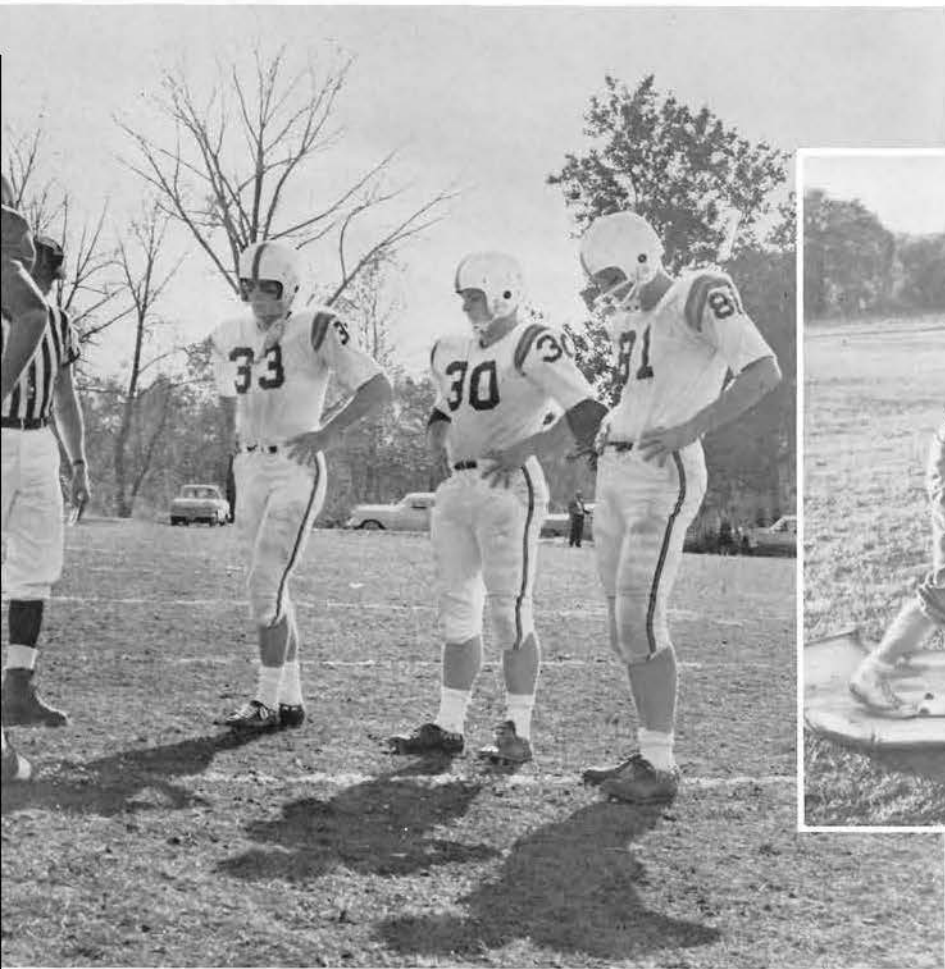

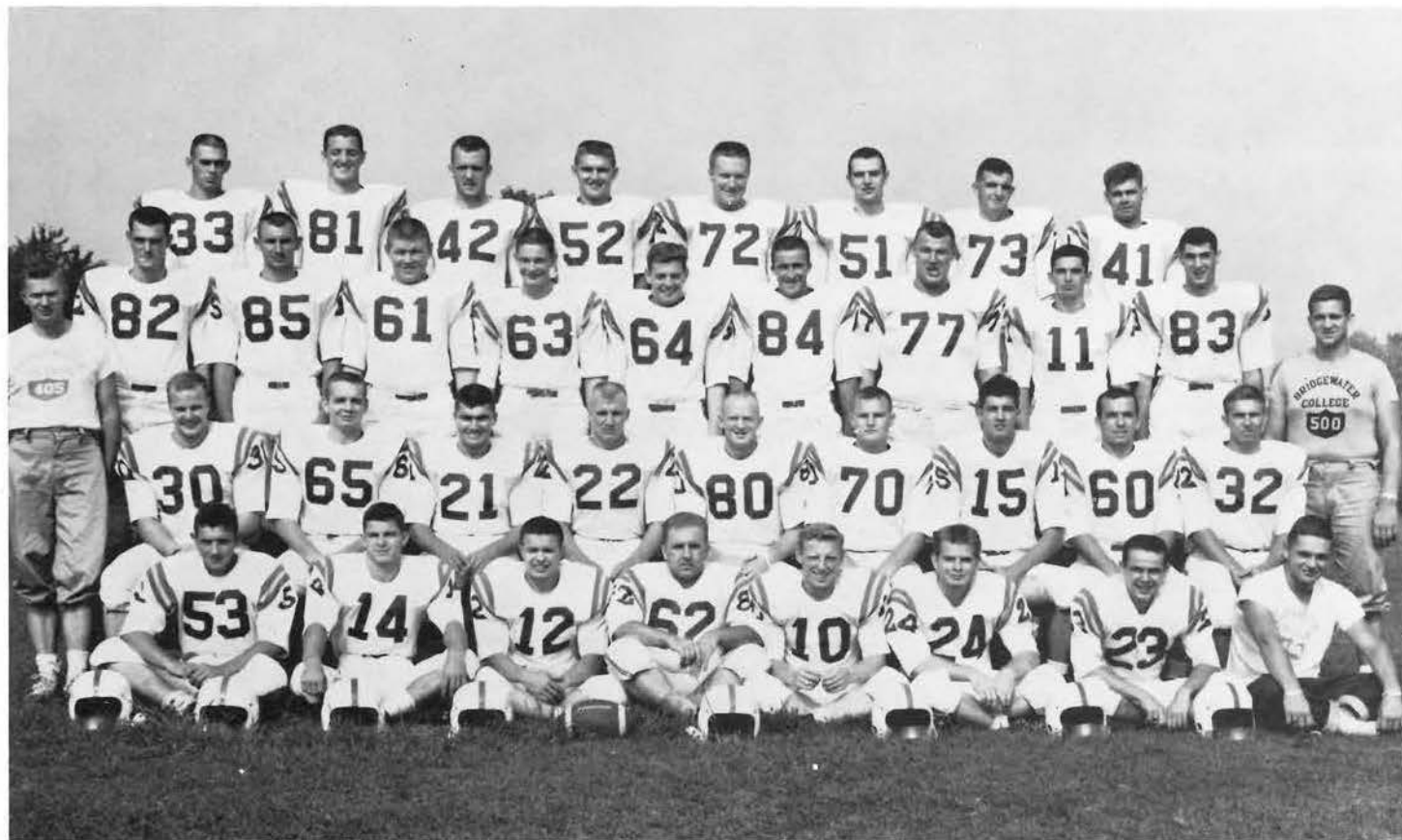

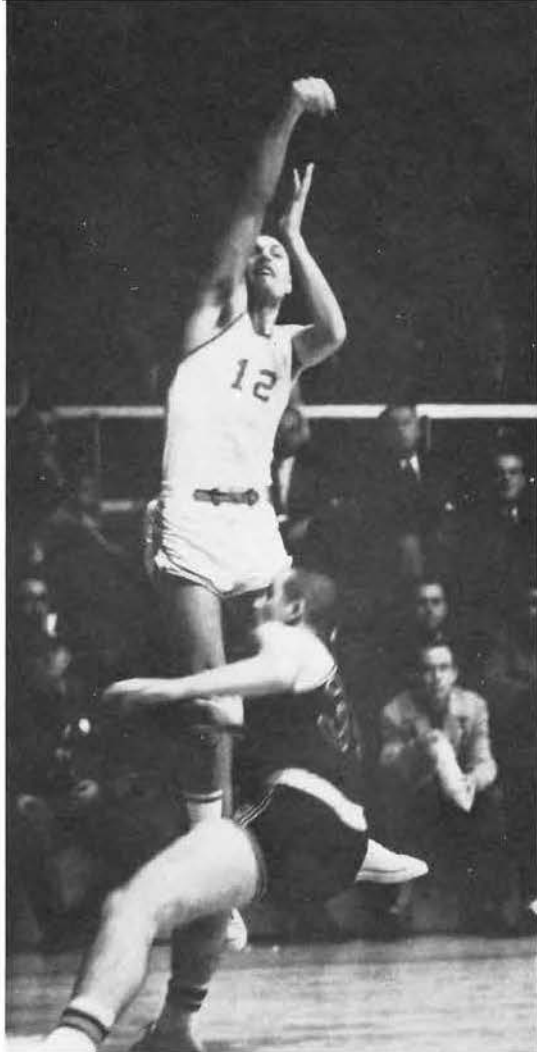

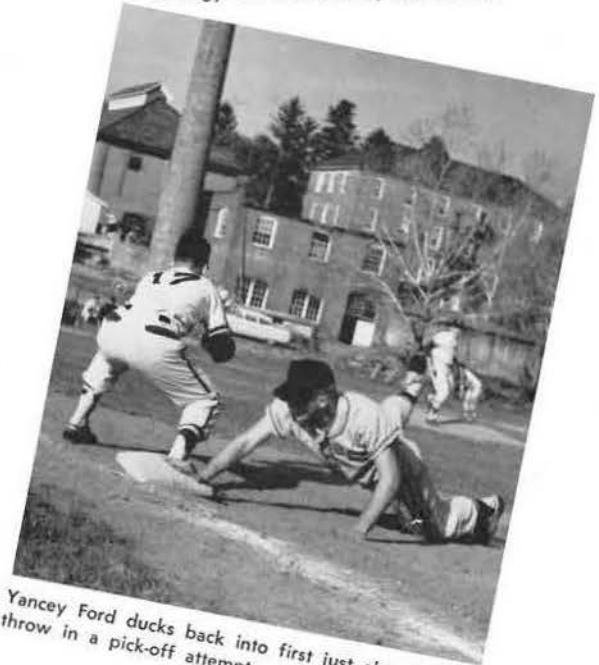

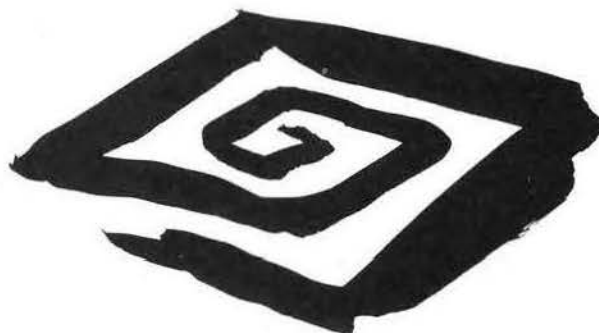

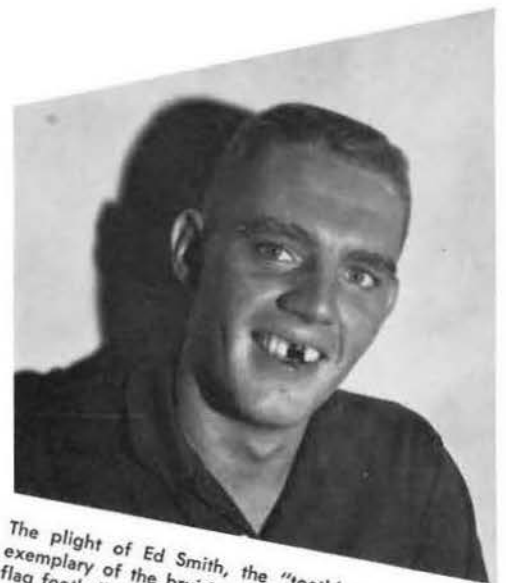

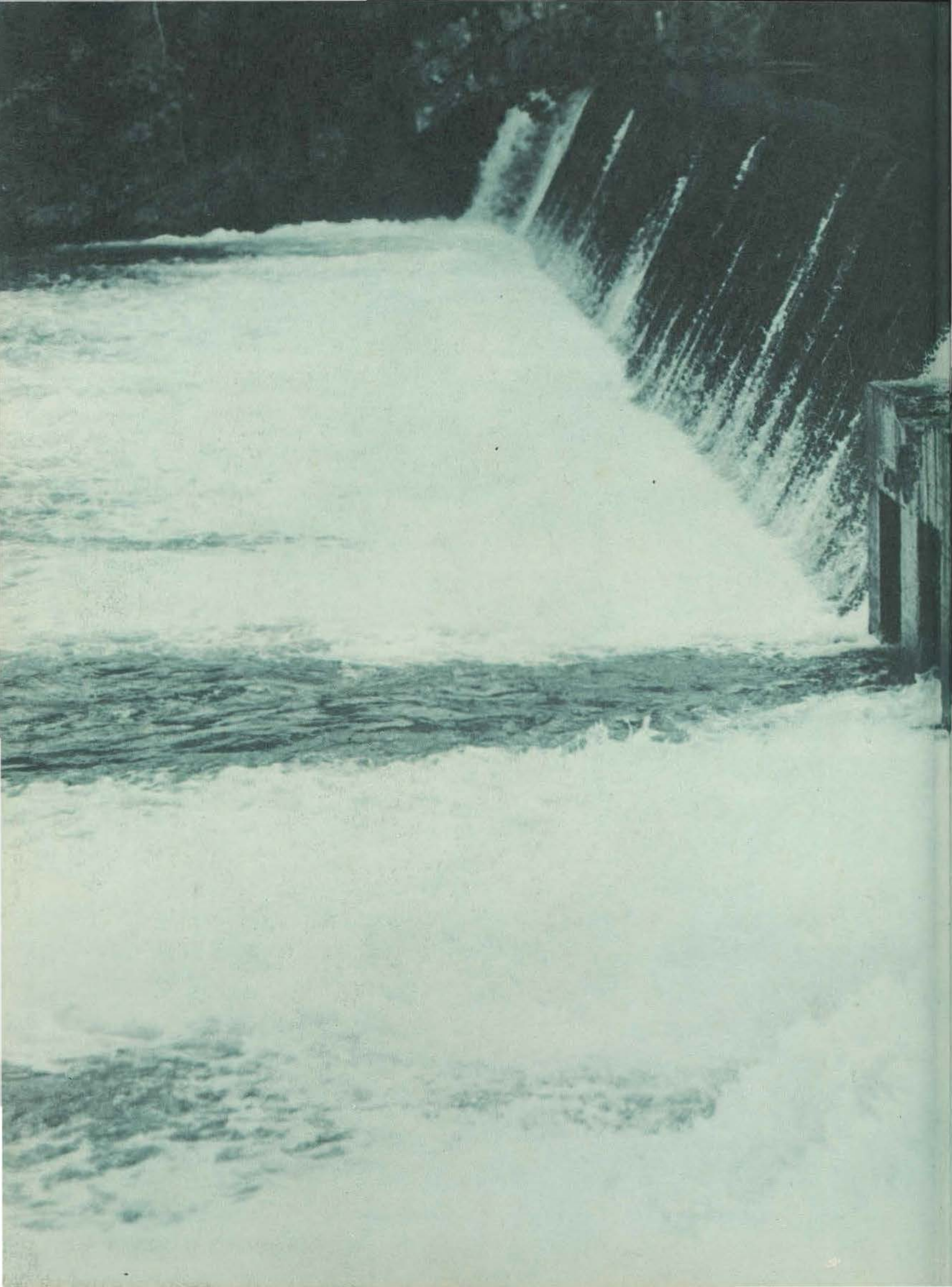
"One ship drives east and another drives west

And not the calm or the strife."

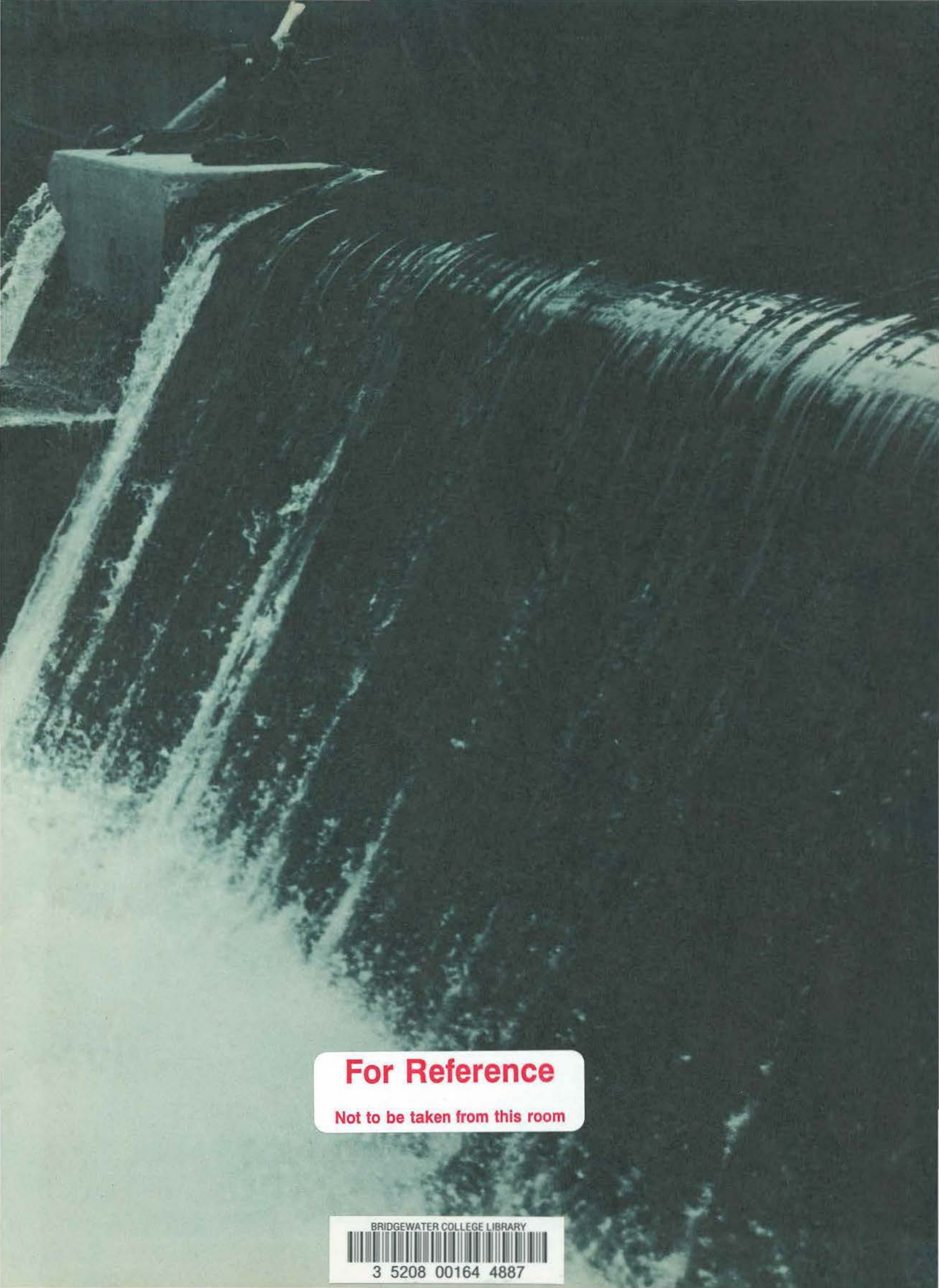
